

## Bed Bug Grant Funding Opportunities

In August 2015, the Tribal Pesticide Program Council (TPPC) developed a Bed Bug Issue Paper that asked federal agencies to direct financial resources towards providing support to tribes struggling with bed bugs. The following grant programs are currently available and tribes may apply to use these grant funds for bed bug related work. Organization	Funding Source	Description
U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development	<a href="#">Indian Housing Block Grant</a>	IHBG funding could be used to address bed bugs. Tribes can add bed bug activities to their Indian Housing Plans.
	<a href="#">Indian Community Development Block Grant</a> <a href="#">Imminent Threat Grants</a>	Noncompetitive, first come-first served grant to be used to eliminate problems which pose an imminent threat to public health or safety. Tribes must prove they have no other funds to address the situation, must document the situation is likely not to occur again once addressed and the problem is not the result of lack of maintenance or routine care etc. It is recommended to speak to assigned Grants Management Specialist before beginning the application.
	<a href="#">Healthy Homes Technical Studies Program</a>	Highly competitive, annual research grant program. Tribal applicants highly encouraged to team with experienced researchers.
	<a href="#">Office of Native American Programs</a> Technical Assistance Request Program <sup>1</sup>	HUD's Office of Native American Programs offers FREE Training and Technical Assistance (T/TA) for Tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities for a wide variety of tribal housing and related issues. 	<a href="#">Indian Community Development Block Single Purpose Grants</a>	A direct grant to fund Housing, Community Facilities, and Economic Development projects. Tribes would need to demonstrate and document that the problem is so severe that homes have to be rehabilitated to eradicate the pests from the unit.
Environmental Protection Agency	<a href="#">FIFRA Cooperative Agreement</a>	Funding could be used by the tribes receiving continuing FIFRA cooperative agreements for bed bug outreach and education activities.
	<a href="#">Environmental Justice Small Grants Program</a>	Supports and empowers communities working on solutions to local environmental and public health issues.
<a href="#">The National Indian Health Board</a>	NIHB may have funding opportunities for capacity building.	
<a href="#">USDA Regional IPM Centers</a>	IPM Centers award competitive grants for a variety of Integrated Pest Management projects.
