Jane's Bio:

Jane Breckinridge is the co-director of Tribal Environmental Action for Monarchs (TEAM), which is partnering with Monarch Watch and seven Native American tribes to restore monarch habitat on tribal lands in Oklahoma, and Tribal Alliance for Pollinators (TAP), which is bringing together cutting edge scientific protocols for monarch/pollinator habitat restoration with traditional ecological knowledge to create a new model for conservation collaboration.

Ms. Breckinridge is the director of the Euchee Butterfly Farm located in Leonard, OK, and has spent the last twenty years raising and exhibiting butterflies throughout the United States and Canada, as well as providing community and youth education on butterflies. She founded the Natives Raising Natives Project in 2013, which is teaching rural tribal members to be butterfly farmers in order to reduce unemployment, promote science education for Native youth and raise awareness of the need for protecting the fragile eco-systems that support butterflies and other threatened pollinators.
